Self Help Groups in Forest Fringe Villages

The object of formation of 'Self Help Groups' (SHG) in Forest Fringe Villages, taken up in different districts involving the eligible and willing JFMC and EDC members, was to open alternative sources of assured income on sustainable basis. In order to restore ecological balance and environmental stability simultaneously efforts were made to curtail the degree of dependency on forest of the forest fringe dwellers who are mostly poor and tribal people.

The target groups were mostly uneducated or sparsely educated people dependent on neighboring forests having practically no knowledge about SHG formation, management of funds, identification of alternative income generating activities, credit requirement and marketing strategy of their products etc. To overcome this problem and to change the mindset of the members of the JFMCs and EDCs as well as that of departmental staff, arrangements were made for training and orientation of the target groups and departmental staff of the identified areas. NABARD, DRDC and some NGOs alongwith the officers of some line departments e.g. Rural Development, Health, Animal Resources Development Department, Sericulture, Agriculture, Fishery etc. and local bank authorities were actively involved in the process.

The following areas were identified as sources of alternative income to the SHGs and accordingly training-cum-orientation camps and workshops on following topics were held at pre-determined venues:

- 1. Training on Sal leaf plate making and supply of plate making machine.
- 2. Collection of medicinal plant products and their processing.
- 3. Training in tailoring including supply of sewing machines.
- 4. Apiary and mushroom cultivation.
- 5. Training on health care of domestic animals and table birds etc. in rural areas.
- 6. Training of 'bidi' making and supply of inputs.
- 7. Training on repairing of pump machine, cycle and motor cycle, electric wiring (where electricity is available) etc.
- 8. Training on vermicomposting, biogas plants, homestead gardening, pisciculture, lac culture, apiculture etc.
- 9. Training on establishment of piggeries, duckeries, poultry farm on small scale.
- 10. Tassar cultivation and supply of high yielding cocoons.
- 11. Rice husking and allied works.
- 12. Soft toy making, handicraft products of different forest produces e.g. bamboo, sabai grass, and jute.

Now many of the SHGs have been working successfully and their performance is encouraging. However, for sustainability of SHGs it is felt that comprehensive training programmes including refresher courses for both target groups and staff have to be undertaken at regular intervals to assess the actual state of affairs including identification of the actual problems faced by the SHGs and to ensure the suitable market linkages for their products.
